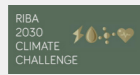

Our over-arching aim is to become a net zero carbon business by 2030, and become a leader in the sustainable design of our built environment.

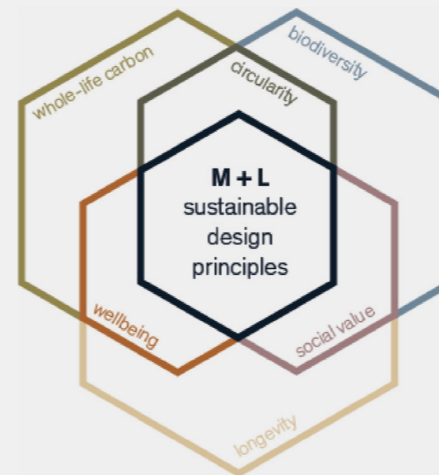
## Projects

Sustainability is embedded into all aspects of our work. From conception to completion and occupation, we endeavour to make choices that will minimise our environmental footprint throughout a building's life-cycle.

Our outlook on sustainable design can be summarised by our six sustainable design principles below.



## Sustainability policy 2024

### Practice

Our roadmap to becoming a net-zero carbon business, both internally and externally, is characterised by an ever-evolving action-plan, which is reviewed annually to maintain performance trajectories. This policy and the objectives inherent to it will be updated in line with those trajectories.

Our sustainability objectives are outlined below:

- + Continue the transition of our office space to carbon neutrality by eliminating Scope 1 emissions entirely, and purchasing all of our electricity from 100% renewable sources
- + Undertake B-Corporation certification for the practice
- + Work to define our own carbon targets for our projects in line with the 2030 RIBA Climate Challenge
- + Provide Post Occupancy Evaluations to at least one project each year from 2025

This is a joint effort from a number of members in the practice, and Morrow + Lorraine's Sustainability Task-force meets fortnightly to discuss on-going research and development in the field of sustainability, and how those best practices can be incorporated in our delivery promises.
